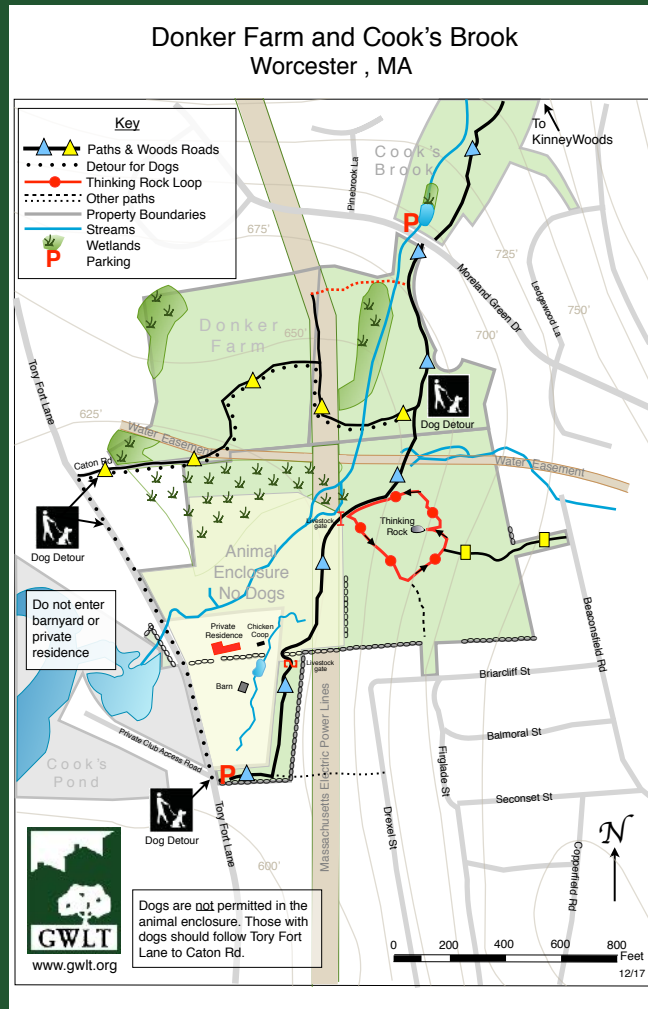

PARKING:

Parking for Donker Farm is available off Tory Fort Lane at the Donker Farm Trailhead, at the Donker Farm driveway, off Beaconsfield, Briarcliff, and Caton Road.

DIRECTIONS:

From Paxton and Points North on Rte 122: South on Rte 122 (Pleasant Street) to Tatnuck Square. At the lights turn left onto Mower Street between the banks. Take the first right onto Tory Fort Lane. Look for the Donker Farm Sign and park in the trailhead parking area.

From Worcester: North on Chandler Street heading towards Tatnuck Square. Go straight through the lights at Pleasant Street, in between the banks, and onto Mower Street. Take the first right onto Tory Fort Lane. Look for the Donker Farm Sign and park in the trailhead parking area.

ABOUT THE FARM

Donker Farm is a 38.54-acre conservation area acquired by the Greater Worcester Land Trust (GWLT) between 2014 and 2016. This property is part of GWLT’s Four-Town Greenway network of greenspace & hiking trails. As the last grandfathered farm in Worcester, GWLT is proud to preserve Donker Farm’s heritage and to offer a hiking trail loop as well as a chance to see our chickens, geese and sheep along with local wildlife in the adjacent woodlands, streams, meadow, and wetlands.



EVENTS
